Notes to the Financial Statements

1. Restricted Funds

During 2015, DVC made the decision to switch to club owned jerseys. The reason for this decision was mainly due to tryout date restrictions implemented by Volleyball Nova Scotia. This does not allow enough time to purchase jerseys before the start of the season.

DVC has added a small replacement cost fee to its memberships which will allow replacement jerseys to be purchased when needed. The funds collected for this replacement initiative are being held as restricted.

2. Team Funds

During the year, teams may undertake fundraising on their own (with Board approval) to support their team's activities. Such fundraising may include, but is not limited to, tournament canteens, team sales and team raffles. Team funds raised may be held, until required, by the club Treasurer and will be earmarked for each specific team. Interest will not accrue on these funds and any funds not used at season's end will flow back to the club.

During the year, teams managed their own funds which were subsequently used to cover local tournament and Nationals. At the end of the season, \$0 remained unused.

3. Accounts Receivable

As at June 30, 2017 there was a balance of \$1,507 receivable. \$519 is owing from Sport NS for remainder of North Preston Program grant. \$988 is owing from player registrations. Of the \$988 amount, \$320 has been identified as potentially uncollectible and therefore transferred to an allowance for doubtful accounts. Please see Note 13 for balances written off to bad debts at year end.

4. Prepaid Expenses

DVC has a monthly rental agreement with Metro Self Storage for a secure place to store the Club's equipment. DVC has paid in advance for storage up to October 11, 2017. This can be extended or cancelled at any time. At June 30, 2017 there remained \$291 in prepaid rental costs.

5. Fixed Assets

During 2015, DVC made the decision to switch to club owned jerseys. The reason for this decision was mainly due to tryout date restrictions implemented by Volleyball Nova Scotia. This does not allow enough time to purchase jerseys before the start of the season.

During 2015, DVC made a bulk purchase totaling \$10,905 to outfit 15 boys and girls teams. This cost has been capitalized and will be depreciated over 5 years. Amortization recorded in 2017 is \$2,181.

6. Accounts Payable

As at June 30, 2017, there was a balance owing of \$5,360. Of this amount, \$1,265 relates to invoices for gym time received after the fiscal year end, \$1,184 for player refunds due to the cancellation of the 14U boys nationals, \$2,000 for athletic scholarships, and the remainder for other miscellaneous expenses. All amounts are expected to be paid.

7. Membership Revenue

DVC offers many different types of programs to both girls and boys ranging in ages from 9 and up.

Tournament play is the main level with players practicing during the week and playing in weekend tournaments. This year we had teams at the following age levels: 13U, 14U, 15U, 16U, 18U and Senior Women's.

This was the first year for the Senior Women's team. This new program was very popular and we are expecting additional growth over the next few years. DVC works hard to provide players of all ages a place to play and are pleased to be able to offer graduating players an opportunity to continue with the sport.

The mini and atomic programs provide the younger ages an opportunity to learn the sport and develop their skills. Currently there are no tournaments offered in Nova Scotia for this age group.


For those players not making a team, DVC offers a skills program where players practice every week, play inter-squad games and work on improving their skills.

2017 was the sixth year of operation for DVC. During this time, the club has seen tremendous growth year over year and continues to be the largest club in NS. The Club originally started with 6 teams and a house league for a total of 108 players. This year, we fielded 14 teams and a variety of programs for a total of 237 players. 2017 membership increased 15% over the last 2 years and was another record year for attendance. 8. Player Deposits

At the beginning of the season, all tournament players are required to have their own ball. Those players requiring one may purchase one through DVC at a cost of \$80. The club attempts to provide these at cost with no markup added.

10. Other Revenues

In 2017, DVC received a \$5,000 grant from the Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM). This grant is not guaranteed and must be applied for each year. The HRM grant can only be used for gym rentals in specified schools. Unused portion of the grant reverts back. Finding suitable gym locations and time are a challenge in HRM, especially ones qualifying for the grant.

In 2017, DVC consumed \$5,588 of the HRM grant with \$1,913 used for practices and \$3,675 used for events (see Note 9). HRM has not requested reimbursement for the \$558 overage.

Bad Debts

2017 was another tough year financially for many of the members and as such, DVC attempted to accommodate people by making alternate payment arrangements. We were able to help out a great number of families. Unfortunately, it also resulted in a number of families defaulting on portions of their membership fees. As per policy, players with unpaid dues are not permitted to join in subsequent years until past dues are fully paid. DVC will attempt to recover these fees where possible.

As at June 30, 2017 there remained 1 membership fee deemed not collectible totaling \$320. To date, efforts to collect have not been successful.

Player Assistance

DVC attempts to work with parents and/or players experiencing financial hardships by making payment options easier and/or by helping to obtain financial assistance. In very special situations, DVC may choose to wave a portion of the membership dues, but only after all other options have been exhausted, and the players situation and family situation is reviewed.

Prior Year Adjustments

In 2017, there were prior year adjustments of \$1,348, the result of a number of stale-dated cheques. Further investigation determined these were no longer payable and as such, it were reversed.
